Narrative ASSIGNMENT: On Wednesday August 17, 2016 I was attending training for the Leica 3D Scanner for crime scene mapping. The class was being taught by Ken Jones, a Training & Service Operations Manager for Leica Geosystems. Ken Jones is a reserve officer and retired Criminalist with the Portland Police Department. The class was being conducted in the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office, Office of Emergency Services. At about 0930 hours, Sergeant Freese entered and advised the class that there was an active shooter situation and she believed it could be an officer involved shooting. Sergeant Freese advised Ken Jones she would likely be needed assistance from members of the class. Sergeant Freese and Ken Jones discussed the situation and it was decided that the class would implement what we learned by using the Leica 3D scanner to map the scene when the incident was over. Ken Jones continued to teach the class. On August 18, 2016 at about 0300 hours, I was called at my residence requesting I respond to the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office Criminal Investigations Division. I arrived and a briefing was conducted. Deputy Havens and I were tasked to begin 3D imaging of the scene. We gathered the equipment, picked up Ken Jones, and responded to the command post located at Thomas Home Center. SCENE: After briefing with command staff, Deputy Havens, Ken Jones, and I responded to the incident location.

The entire complex and part of Sutter Road was encompassed in an outer perimeter.
Three inner perimeters were set up as areas significant to evidence collection.
An area near the southwest corner of the apartment building directly north of the
manager's office was identified as the spot Deputy Mowrey had fired his weapon
from.
The front porch of the manager's office was identified as a spot that
fired at.
The building of was identified as the building that
lived in.
A fire truck was idling in the parking lot just north of . An
ambulance was parked in the parking lot west of . The body of
was located in the ambulance.
Ken Jones, Deputy Havens, and I deployed the Leica scanner and began mapping and
imaging the area. Community Services Officer Hanson, Evidence Technician
Campbell, and Deputy Jones arrived on scene and assisted with the scanning. See
Evidence Technician Campbell's report for details.
Deputy Coroner VanBuskirk arrived on scene at about 0539 hours and took custody
of the body of Deputies Melendy and Helm assisted.
AUTOPSY:
On Monday August 22, 2016 at about 1317 hours, I arrived at the Humboldt County
Sheriff's Office Coroner Division for the autopsy of David Fulton. Dr. Super,
volunteers Allie Lukes, and Catherine Alexander, District Attorney Investigator
Kirkpatrick, Department of Justice Criminalists Rosenfeld, and Cloutier, Eureka
Police Officer Cosetti, Deputy Coroner VanBuskirk, and I were present.
It was verified that the body bag was sealed prior to the beginning of the
autopsy. The autopsy was performed by Sr. Super. Criminalist Rosenfeld Cloutier
collected any items of evidentiary value including photographs.
Investigator Fulton arrived and was at the autopsy from about 1543 hours to 1606
hours.
At the conclusion of the autopsy Dr. Super advised me that the cause of the death
of David Fulton was multiple high velocity gunshot wounds.
